## List of ailments that Craig (Paramedic) is happy to deal with

Chest infections UTI's (Urine problems) Conjunctivitis Eyes Ears problems and ear checks including hearing loss. Rash/spots including Acne. Lumps, Bumps, and boils DVT (deep vein thrombosis) Cellulitis Coughs and cold **Diarrhoea & Vomiting** COPD Asthma Abscess (not dental) Bowel problems and constipation Headaches including migraine. Sore Throats- including Tonsillitis. **Testicular Pain** Mental Health low mood /Anxiety – should be referred to Axel/Melissa MSK – Physio/FC practitioners Dizziness/vertigo **Excessive sweating** Infected wounds Shingles Tiredness



### Inclusions & Exclusions for ANP ARRS Remote & F2F Sessions

### **Remote Consultations inclusions**

Conditions which can be dealt with initially over the phone:

- Rashes, acne, sore throats, abscesses/boils, paronychia, eye symptoms (all with photos)
- Non-acute dyspnoea
- Non-acute abdominal or pelvic pain
- Chest pain (please confirm as below in exclusions too)
- Coughs, colds, exacerbation of COPD, sinusitis
- Urinary symptoms
- Bowel symptoms
- Headache/migraine
- Medication reviews and queries
- Menstrual disorders
- Contraceptive advice and prescribing
- Menopause/HRT
- Nausea, pain or bleeding in early pregnancy
- Gout
- Pain management
- Vague symptoms/TATT/weight loss
- Sick note requests
- Anxiety/depression/OCD (though we do have PCN mental health practitioners)
- MSK problems (though we have first contact physios)
- Sleep problems

### **Remote Consultations Exclusions**

- Acute abdominal pain
- Acute dyspnoea
- Chest or Abdominal Pain (please confirm)
- Severe or Acute mental health problems (such as psychosis)
- Acutely unwell children
- Rectal bleeding
- Earache



# Flu and Covid Vaccination Clinics

For the first time, this year we have a joint flu and covid vaccination clinic.

To make our flu and covid vaccination clinic run as efficiently as possible, please wear clothing that can be quickly and easily removed.

- Please go to the back entrance of the building if you have a vaccine booked where a member of our reception team will greet you.
- Please remove all coats and jackets ready for your vaccines to be administered.
- Wait times may be longer than normal so please be patient with us.
- If you haven't yet booked your vaccinations please contact surgery as soon as possible.
- To save our reception team time phoning patients please let us know if you would like to decline either/both vaccines.

### **Repeat Prescription Requests**

We are still receiving a large number of requests over the telephone despite our admin staff reiterating on each phone call that we do not do this.

Our phone lines are extremely busy at the moment and prescription requests block the telephone lines for those patients trying to get through to make appointments and for more urgent queries.

Please ensure you have either registered for the online service/NHS App. Alternatively you can order prescriptions on our website or telephone the Medicines Order Line by calling the surgery and pressing option 4.

We also ask that you do not request medication too early. If there is a reason please put a note on the request otherwise it will be declined.

The only exception to this is if you are housebound and it is urgent. In which case please call the surgery after 5pm if possible when our phones are less busy.

### Frequent attenders

We have run a search to locate all our patients who have attended the surgery more than 25 times in a year. Our Care-Coordinators are now running a project to see if there is any help, we can give these patients.

A wellbeing questionnaire has been sent out to all these patients. These can be filled in online or in person. The questionnaire asks a range of questions about the patients help and any services they have already tried.

We have referred a few patients for weight management, mental health services, our social prescriber and other services which may benefit them. Our Care-Coordinators are keeping a close eye on these patients, and we will keep you up to date as these progresses.

We are also hoping to do this with patients who frequently attend The Emergency Centre at Chesterfield Royal Hospital.
